Allegation	<p>Source #1: (U) 21 August 2017. Twitter users and media outlets circulated reports claiming, 20 civilians killed by Coalition airstrike on Jazaa' Sharqi in southern Al-Hasakah outskirts on 20 August. Reports added, French media claimed the village was controlled by ISIS, but local media denied the claim.</p> <p>Source #2: SM circulated reports stating that CFs targeted the mosque of Al Jaza'a village, in the east countryside of Al Shadadi, in Al Haskah province. The strike destroyed the mosque in its entirety and 21 individuals killed. All the dead were buried in a mass grave.</p> <p>Source #3: 1. A strike is being reported to CJTF-OIR PAO press desk by Ellen Francis of Reuters and originally reported by Syrian Observatory for Human Rights. a. When: August 19 (she said Saturday but the publication from SOHR claims it as the 19th) b. YES August 19th 2017: (S1213) Al-Jazza'a village, near Shadadi, Al-Hasakah governorate, Syria Summary: In a major civilian casualty incident, between 15 and 41 people have died following an alleged US-led Coalition strike on Al-Jazza'a village. The civilians were leaving Asr prayer at the village mosque when they were hit, local media sources reported. According to Hasaka Rasd and multiple other sources, "the village was not controlled by any military faction and was located on a contact line between the state organization and the Kurdish units". The alleged strike resulted in significant material destruction as well as the loss of many lives, Baladi news reported that the mosque was destroyed entirely. Those that died in this event were "buried in a mass grave" in the village, according to local reports. Most sources put the death toll at 21, though Smart said that at least 15 had died.</p>		

According to Iuvmonline, as many as 41 had died. It reported: “Activists said on Twitter that coalition raids resulted in the deaths of 41 martyrs on the village of Jazaa in the south-eastern province of Hasaka, where coalition aircraft targeted air raids on the village mosque during the Asr prayer on Saturday, which led to dozens of injuries also”.

RFI Response:

Reporting: “The activists added that the international coalition aircraft launched an air strike ahead of the Asr prayer on Saturday, the mosque of the village of Jazaa (الجزاع) in the southeastern countryside east of the city of Shaddadi, which led to the death of about 21 people and the destruction of the mosque in full.”

Unfortunately we have been unable to geolocate the Jazaa village. The only coordinates we can suggest are the middle point of ISIS-controlled Hasakah: 35.6751474, 41.0449219

The information we have suggests that the strike would have occurred on an

approximately 35 km radius from those coordinates.
