<b>Allegation</b>	<p><b>1. Source #1:</b>            (U) Reports of CIVCAS from US Airstrikes on Al-Mayadeen in Deir Ez-Zor: Social media activists and regional media outlets on Facebook and Twitter circulated reports that alleged US airstrikes on al-Mayadeen neighborhoods in Deir ez-Zor resulted in killing 20 civilians including 7 children. On 8 JUL, Amaq News Agency released a video depicting the body of a dead child being pulled out of the rubbles and other child being treated for injuries, alleging that was caused by US airstrikes on al-Mayadeen neighborhoods. The link to the video will be provided at a later time due to some technical difficulty.</p>
